



#### St Conor's College Top Tips for Revision



- 1. **Study in a quiet place free from distractions.** Switch off your phone, TV, music etc.
- 2. **Have a designated study time each day.** Try to spend at least 2 hours on schoolwork each night. Complete your homework and use any extra time to do revision.
- 3. Make a 'revision timetable' in preparation for your exams. Use the timetable provided in this booklet and stick to it.
- 4. **Create and use a variety of study aids.** There are some provided in this booklet. They will help you to memorise and learn the information you need to know.
- 5. **Get help.** Ask friends, family and teachers to help you.
- 6. Take a 5-10 minute break every hour and do some exercise, go for a short walk or make a healthy snack.
- 7. Allow yourself time each day to relax and make sure you get 8 hours sleep each night.
- 8. **Drink water and eat well.** Eat good brain foods wholegrain foods, blueberries, broccoli, tomatoes, oily fish, nuts.
- 9. **Don't panic if you feel a bit nervous.** A certain amount of nervousness actually helps you perform to the best of your ability, producing a rush of adrenaline that helps you to feel alert and focused.
- 10. **Think positively!** You can and will do well but you need to do the work now.





If stress affects you, try to find ways to maintain a positive attitude and cultivate a positive approach during your revision.

#### **REVISION STRATEGY 1**

#### **MNEMONICS**

- A mnemonic (pronounced without the 'M') is used to assist your memory and is about creating a way in which you can remember key information.
- A common mnemonic for remembering lists is to create an easily remembered acronym, or,
   taking each of the initial letters of the words to be remembered. Anyone can create their
   own mnemonic to aid the memorisation of vital information.
- In summary, you can create a code using rhymes, phrases or acronyms, which help you to recall information that is essential for doing well in your exams.

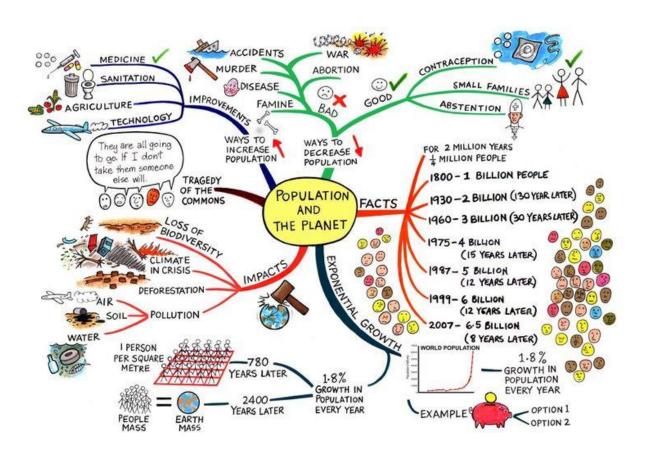

#### **REVISION STRATEGY 2**

#### MIND MAPS

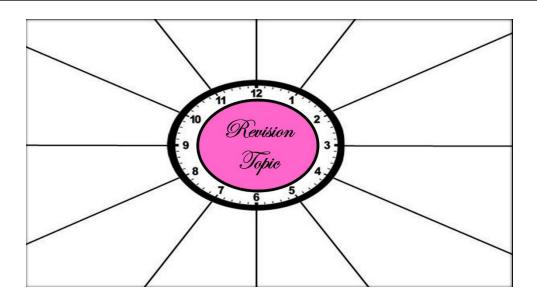
- Mind Maps engage your whole brain in thinking and allow you to see the **big picture** (how all the different ideas are connected to one another)
- The organisation **reflects how the brain remembers**, linking facts and ideas.
- The process of creating a mind map deepens the learning process.
- Mind Maps appeal to your senses with their visual elements images and different colours help you to remember your notes.
- More **brain friendly** and allows you to easily recall information.

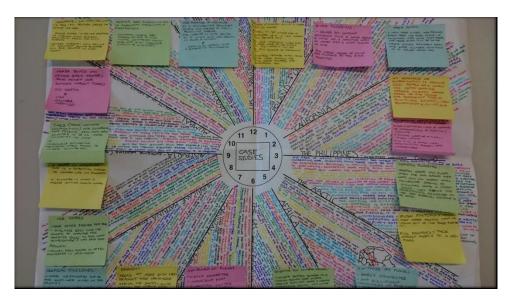


#### **REVISION STRATEGY 3**

### **REVISION POSTERS & DIAGRAMS**

- A revision poster is a good way of summarising your notes and making them more memorable.
- Try to ensure that the key information that you don't already know is included in the poster.
- Use as much colour and as many pictures as possible to highlight any key points.







#### **ENGLISH**

Your examination is a **reading** assessment. It will last for one hour. Each question will assess one of the following key skills which are part of the reading process:

- **Finding information**, e.g., Find three sounds relating to the sound of an aeroplane
- Word meaning, e.g., What does the word 'liberty' mean in the following line?
- Inference, e.g., What can we infer about Maman's attitude towards the Germans when she describes them as 'dogs'?
- **Symbolism**, e.g., Everything Count Dracula wears is black. What do you think the colour black could symbolise?
- **Identifying methods**, e.g., Looking at both extracts, find an example of each of the following techniques used by the writer. (Techniques will be named and you need to find an example of each.)
- **Effect**, e.g., Why do you think the writer ends the extract with a short sentence?
- **Supporting an interpretation / opinion**, e.g., A teacher read both extracts and said 'I don't really think Joelie fully understands the danger she is in. The writer creates a real sense of how life is different now, but I think Joelie doesn't see how bad the situation is.' Pick one of the statements and explain why you agree or disagree with the teacher. (There will be three statements for you to choose from and a space to justify your interpretation or opinion.)

#### **Revision activities**

- Reading isn't improved by one strategy alone or by a last-minute quick fix, but rather by continuous focus over the year. You should read often and widely from a variety of genres. (Aim to read for at least 20 minutes every day.)
- To add to this, your teacher will provide you with additional reading comprehension activities containing a variety of practice questions to help develop the skills listed above and prepare you for the exam. Complete all these activities.
- Revise and be able to identify language techniques.
- Know what a paragraph is and ensure you have taken your answers from within the specified paragraphs.
- Rewrite x3 any spellings you did not get right in your exercise book so far this term. Work with your teacher to find strategies which work for you.
- Teachers can only credit what they can read. Keep your work legible and practise tidy handwriting with correct punctuation.

#### On the day of the exam, remember to

• Read the text and questions thoroughly and attempt every question to the best of your ability. Remember you do not need to understand every word in the text to be able to answer all the questions accurately. Do not become discouraged and always put in your best effort. Good luck!



Topic	Knowledge Required
Health and Safety in the Workshop	<ul> <li>Students should be familiar with the rules and safety procedures associated with being in the school workshop. E.g. wearing appropriate PPE, following instructions, knowing where the emergency stop buttons are.</li> </ul>
Properties of Plastics	<ul> <li>Students should be able to define and give example of the terms thermoplastic and thermosetting plastic.</li> <li>Students should be aware of the 4 main properties of acrylic <i>Page</i></li> </ul>
Use of machines in the workshop	<ul> <li>Students should be familiar with the components of the line bender/ strip heater and the health and safety rules associated with using it. <i>Page 16</i></li> <li>Pupils should also be familiar with how to use the pillar drill and health safety rules to work with it safely.</li> </ul>
Types of files/ Filing Techniques/ Finishing of plastics	<ul> <li>Students should be able to draw the symbols and name the 5 different types of hand files that can be used in the workshop and state what they are used for.</li> <li>Pupils should be able to describe in detail, using sketches of how to appropriately finish a piece of acrylic e.g. cross file, draw file, wet and dry paper, polisher.</li> <li>Pupils should be aware of the health and safety rules for</li> </ul>
Isometric Sketching	<ul> <li>Students will be required to make use of isometric paper to correctly sketch an isometric image that has been given to them.</li> <li>Sketches should be done in pencil and rendered (Shaded) with a colouring pencil.</li> </ul>
